phleps/phlebos = vein, e.g. phlebitis

phobos = fear, e.g. phobia, phobophobia, agoraphobia

phōs/phōtos = light, e.g. phosphorus, photograph, photosynthesis

phrazein = to tell, **phrasis** = speech, e.g. phrase, periphrasis = circumlocution

phrassein = to fence in, **diaphragma** = partition, e.g. diaphragm

phroneein = to think, **phrēn/phrenos** = midriff or diaphragm,
location of heart & passions, hence mind,
e.g. frenetic, schizophrenia, phrenalgia, phrenectomy

phyein = to grow, **physis** = nature,
phyton and **phyma** = growth, plant e.g. physics,
physiology, physician (with L. suffix), phytophotography

/ **phylassein** = to guard, **phylax/akos** = a guard,
e.g. prophylactic

phyllon = leaf (cf petalon), e.g. chlorophyll

phylon = race or tribe, e.g. phylum, phylogenetic

planaein = to wander, **planos** & **planktos** = wandering,
e.g. planet < planetes, plankton

plassein = to form, **plastos** = formed,
e.g. plasma, plastic, -plasty, protoplasm, cardioplasty

platys/eia/y = broad, e.g. plate, platelet, platypus

pleion, comparative of polys = more, e.g. pleonasm, pleonexia

plessein = to strike (cf. koptein), **plēgē** = blow,
e.g. paraplegia, apoplectic, quadriplegic

pleura = rib, e.g. pleurisy (cf. L costa)

-ploos = folded, **haploos** = single, **diploos** = double
e.g. haploid, diploid

pneein = to breathe, to blow, **pneuma/pneumatos** (result suffix),
pneumon = lung, e.g. pneumatic, apnea, pneumonia

poieein = to make, e.g. poem, poetic, onomatopoeia

***polis** = city or country, e.g. politics, political

polios/a/on = gray, e.g. poliomyelitis

polos = pole as in North pole, e.g. polar

polys/pollē/y = much, many, e.g. polynomial,
polygamy, polygonal, polypus, polyp, polychrome

poros = passage, strait, e.g. pore, porous, osteoporosis

pous/podos = foot, e.g. podiatry, chiropodist,
octopus, polypus, tripod, Oedipus

prattein = to do, **praxis** = a doing, **praktikos** = ?
e.g. practical, practice, chiropractor

prōktos = anus, e.g. proktology

pseudēs = false, e.g. pseudonym, pseudo-

psychē = life & spirit & soul & mind & personality,
e.g. psychology, psychosis, psychosomatic, psychiatry
