**psychros/a/on** = cold (cf. *kryos* p 179), e.g. *psychotherapy*

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**pteron** = wing, e.g. **pterodactyl, helicopter**

**ptōsis** = a falling, **ptōma** = fallen body, corpse  
e.g. **symptom, ptomaine, carpoptosis**

**ptyein** = to spit, e.g. *ptyalism*

**pyelos** = pelvis, e.g. *pyelonephritis, pyelotomy*

**pylē** = gate, e.g. *pylon, pylorus*

**pyon** = pus, e.g. **pyorrhea, pyogenesis**

**pyr/pyros** = fire, **pyretos** = fever,  
e.g. **pyrotechnic, pyrogen, pyro-**

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**Greek Letter Rho, P)**

**rhēgnein** = to break, **-rrhagia** = bleeding,  
e.g. **hemorrhage**

**rhaptein** = to sew, + **ōdē** (song) = **rhapsode,**  
e.g. **-rhapsy**

**rheein** = to flow, **rheuma/rheumatos** = flowing,  
e.g. **diarrhea, gonorrhea, rheumatism, pyorrhea**

**rhis/rhinos** = nose, e.g. **rhinitis,**

**otorhinolaryngo-, rhinocerous**

**rhiza** = root, e.g. **rhizoid, rhizotomy**

**rhodon** = rose

**rhombos** = spinning top in shape of rhombos

**rhythmos** = regular recurring motion,

e.g. **rhythm, -rhythmia**

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### **Greek Letter Sigma**

**sakcharon** = sugar < Sansrit śarkarā

**salpinx/salpingos** = trumpet, used now for tube,

either Fallopian or Eustachian, cf. **salpingooophoritis**

vs. **salpingopharyngeal**

**sarx/sarkos** = flesh, e.g. **sarcophagus, sarcoma**

**sauros** = lizard, **deinos** = fearful, **dinosaur**

**schizein** = to split, **schistos** = split,

e.g. **schizophrenic, schistosomiasis, schism, schist**

**seiein** = to shake, **seismos** = earthquake, e.g. **seismograph**

**sēma/sēmatos, semeion** = sign, e.g. **semiotics**

**sēpein** = to rot, **sēpsis** = rotting or decay,

**sapros** = rotten, **sēptikos** = putrefactive

e.g. **antiseptic, asepsis, saprogenic**

**sialon** = saliva, e.g. sialorrhea, sialosis

**sideros** = iron (cf L ferrum), e.g. siderite, sidero-

**sigma** =  $\Sigma$ , -σ-, -ς, later C-shape), e.g. sigmoid

**siphōn/siphōnos** = siphon, tube, pipe

**sitos** = grain —> food, e.g. parasitos

**skellein** = to dry up, **skeleton/ē/os** = dried, esp. body

**skelos** = leg, e.g. isosceles triangle

**sklēros/ē/on** = hard, e.g. arteriosclerosis

**skopeein** = to examine, inspect, look out for  
(cf. skeptesthai, sceptikos) **skopos** = spy  
e.g. microscope, gyroscope, stethoscope

**sōma/sōmatos** = body, cf. L **corpus**,  
e.g. psychosomatic, chromosome, somatology

**spaein** = draw or wrench or snatch, **spasmos** = convulsion  
e.g. spasm, spasmodic, spastic
