sperma/spermatos = seed (cf. L. semen),

e.g. sperm, spermatozoon, spora = sowing (of seed), seed

sporadikos = scattered, e.g. spore, sporadic, sporidium

sphaira = sphere, globe, e.g. atmosphere, spheroid

sphingein = bind tightly, e.g. sphinktēr (agent),

e.g. sphincter

sphyzein = to throb, beat, **sphygmos** = pulse,

e.g. asphyxia, bradysphygmia

splēn/splēnos = spleen, e.g. hepatosplenitis

spondylos = vertebra, e.g. spondylodynia, spondyloschisis,

spondylotherapy, spondylitis, spondylodiagnosis

spongos = sponge

sta- & **stē-** (verb *histanai* = to stand),

cf. L stare/statum p 122

stasis = standing, stoppage, ΣΤΑΣΙΣ

cf. apostasis, diastasis, diastēma

e.g. static, statics, apostasy, metastasis,

hemostatic, ecstasy

stellein = to send (**stolos** = something sent)

e.g. systole = drawing up or contraction,
 diastole = heart muscle dilatation or expansion,
 apostle)

staphylē = bunch of grapes, uvula, e.g. staphyloma

steat/o = fat (cf. lipos p 183), e.g. steatoma

stenos/ē/on = narrow (opp. platys or eurys),
 e.g. stenosis

stereos/a/on = solid, e.g. cholesterol,
 stereoscopic, stereophonic

sternon & stēthos = breast or chest,
 e.g. sternum, stethoscope

sthenos = strength, e.g. calisthenics, asthenia

stizein = to tatoo, **stigma** = a tatoo

stoma/stomatos = mouth or opening,
stomachos = throat ... stomach,
 e.g. stoma, stomatitis, stomach

strephein = to turn, **strep sis** = ?, **streptos** = twisted,
 e.g. streptococcus, streptosepticemic

stylos = pillar or pole, e.g. style, peristyle,
 stylist, stylize, L. stilus

syrinx/syringos = shepherd's pipe, pipe, e.g. syringe

tachys/y/eia = swift or quick,

e.g. tachometer, tachycardia

tautōn = article “the” = Greek το + auton (self p 153) = the same,

e.g. tautology = periphrasis = circumlocution

tattein or tassein = to arrange,

taxis = action of arranging,

e.g. taxonomy, taxi(meter), tax

technē = art or skill

e.g. technique, technology, technical, technician,

tetanos = stretched, e.g. tetanus

tenōn/tenontos = tendon, e.g. tenonectomy, tenonitis

tonos = something stretched, tension, e.g. tone, tonic

tēle = far off or at a distance,

e.g. telephone, telegraph, television,

telepathy, telescope, telephoto

telos = completion or goal or end, e.g. teleology

thalamos = inner room or chamber, e.g. thalamus

thalassa = sea, e.g. thalassemia, thalassocracy

thanatos = death, e.g. euthanasia
