tithenai = to put or place

thesis = action of placing, thema/atos

e.g. thesis, metathesis, synthesis,

prosthesis, theme, thematic

thēkē = case or chest, e.g. apothecary,

bibliothèque, discothèque

therapeuein = to be a servant to, take care of,

therapeia = ?, e.g. therapy, therapeutics,

psychotherapy, physiotherapy

thermos/ē/on = hot

e.g. thermos, thermal, thermodynamics

thōrax = breastplate, chest, e.d. thorax

thrix/trichos = hair, e.g. -trichia, -trichous

thrombos = clot, e.g. thrombosis

thymós = spirit or strong feeling or passion,

e.g. dysthymia

thýmos = thymus gland,

e.g. thymus, thymoma, thymolysis

thyra = door, **thyreos** = shield shaped like a door

e.g. thyroid, thyroidectomy, hyperthyroidism

tokos childbirth, e.g. toco-, tocograph, tocology

temnein = to cut, tomos & tomē = cutting,

entemon = insect

e.g. atom, anatomy, appendectomy, entomology,

dichotomy, diatomic

topos = place, e.g. topic, topography, isotope

toxon = bow . . . bow and arrows,

toxikon pharmakon = poison for arrows

e.g. toxicology, toxicity, toxic, antitoxin, intoxication

trachys/y/eia = rough, e.g. trachea,

tracheitis, tracheotomy

trauma/traumatōs = wound, e.g. trauma, traumata

trēma/atos = perforation, trésis = boring a hole, e.g. trésis

trepein = to turn, tropē = a turning,

e.g. tropic, allotrope, idiotropic

trephein = to nourish, trophē = nourishment,

e.g. atrophy, dystrophy

tribein, tryein = to rub, tripsis = rubbing,

e.g. tripsis, lithotripsis, trypsin

tympanon = drum, e.g. tympanum

typhoein = to delude, typhos = fever, delusion,

e.g. typhus, typhoid

typtein = to beat or strike,

typos = a blow, impression, pattern, model

e.g. type, archetype, typical, typology

xanthos/ē/on = yellow, e.g. xanthosis, xanthoma

xenos = foreign, e.g. xenia, xenogamy

xēros = dry, e.g. xerosis

xylon = wood, e.g. xylophone, xylography

zeein = to boil, ekzēma = boiling out, e.g. eczema

zōnē = belt, girdle, e.g. zone

zōon = animal, e.g. zoology, zoo,

protozoon, mesozoic

zygon = yoke, zygoma/atos = yoking, e.g. zygoma, zygote

zymē = leaven, e.g. enzyme
