hiare/hiatum = to open (cf. aperire), hiatus = opening

hiberna = winter camp, e.g. hibernate

homo/hominis = human being (cf. GK anthropos)

e.g. homicide, homo sapiens (cf. GK homos p 178 = like,

e.g. homogenous, homosexuality)

humana/us/um = human, e.g. human, humanities

Terence: "homo sum: humani nil a me alienum puto"

hora = hour, e.g. hour

hortus = garden, e.g. horticulture

humerus = upper arm, e.g. humerus (cf. femur)

(h)umere = to be moist, humor = liquid,

humida = damp, e.g. humo(u)r, humid

humus = soil, e.g. humus, posthumous

ire/itum = to go, e.g. exit, ambient, coitus, transition

ignis = fire, e.g. ignite, ignition

ilium = flank (half pelvis) ALSO ileum = lower small intestine

e.g. iliofemoral (corr. book), iliocostal, ALSO ileocecal, ileorectal

inguen/inguinis = groin, e.g. ilioinguinal, inguinoscrotal

intestina/us/um (intus + ina), internal, intestine

jacere/jactum (iect-) = to throw, e.g. ab- e- con- de- in-
inter- ob- pro- re- sub-JECT-ion -ure -ive -ivity -or -ory
jactare/jactatum, ejaculation

jungere/junctum = to join, jugum = yoke, jugulum (dimin = small yoke)
e.g. conjugal, junction, juncture, disjunctive, jugular

labi/lapsum = to slip, noun = lapsus
e.g. lapse, collapse, relapse

labium = lip, plural labia, e.g. labial, labiogingival

lac/lactis = milk, e.g. lactose, delactation

lacrima = tear, e.g. lacrimose

laedere/laesum = to hurt by striking, e.g. elide, collision

laevus/a/um = left (= sinister/tra, opp. dexter), e.g. levulose

lapis/lapidis = stone, e.g. lapidary, dilapidate

larva = ghost, e.g. larvae (plural)

latus/lateris = side, e.g. bilateral, collateral

latus/a/um = wide, e.g. latitude

lavare/lotum (lut-) = wash, e.g. lava, dilution, lotion, alluvial

lenis = soft, mild, e.g. lenient

lens/lentis = lentil, e.g. lens, lentil

letum/lethum = death (= mors/mortis,
cf. GK lethe p 182 = forgetfulness), e.g. lethal

levare/levatum = to raise, **levis** = light, e.g. elevate

* **lex/legis** = law, e.g. legal, legality

* **liber/libri** = book, e.g. library & **liber/era/erum** = free, e.g. liberty

libet = it pleases, **libido/libidinis** = pleasure, e.g. libidinous

ligare/ligatum = to bind, e.g. ligature (e.g. æ, œ), ligament

lignum = wood, e.g. ligneous

limen/liminis = threshold, e.g. eliminate, subliminal

linea = line, e.g. linear, lineal, lineation

lingua = tongue, e.g. lingual, linguistics

liquare/liquatum = melt, e.g. liquefaction, liquid

locus = a place (plural loci), e.g. dislocation,
locality, locomotive

longa/us/um = long (cf. latus), e.g. longitude, long

lucere = to shine, **lux/lucis** & **lumen** = light
e.g. lucid, translucent, illumination, luminescent
