cortex/corticis = bark (of tree),

e.g. cerebral cortex (cf. medulla)

costa = rib, e.g. intracostal, cf. coxa = hip

crescere/cretum (cf. cernere/cretum) = increase

e.g. crescent, increment

crus/cruris = leg, e.g. crural

cubare/cubatam = lie down, e.g. incubate

incumbere -> incumbent, cubitus = elbow, e.g. cubital

cuneus = wedge, e.g. cuneate, cuneiform

cuprum = copper, Cu, cupric

currere/cursum = to run, cursus = course

e.g. concurrent, recourse, excursion, occur, concur

cuspidis/cuspidis = point, e.g. dent cusp, cuspid

-cutere/-cussum = shake, e.g. concussion, percussion

cutis = skin, e.g. cuticle, cutaneous (cf. GK derma)

dens/dentis = tooth, e.g. dental, cf. GK odous/odontos

dexter/dextra/dextrum = right (opp. left = laeva/sinistra)

e.g. dexterity, ambidextrous, dextrose

digitus = finger/toe, e.g. digital

dormire/dormitum = to sleep, e.g. dormant, dormitory

dorsum = back, e.g. dorsal

ducere/ductum = lead, eg. duct, -duce, -duction, dux/ducis = leader

ductile, ad-, con-, de-, in-, intro-, pro-, se-, re- etc.

durus/dura/durum = hard, e.g. durable, duration, endure

edere/esum = eat, edible, obesity

ego = I, e.g. superego, alter ego, altera ego

errare/erratum = wander, e.g. aberration, erratum

exter <- e, ex, extra on outside (prefixes p 70-1)

exterior (comparative) extremum (superlative)

see p 37, e.g. external, extremity

facere/factum, fic-/fic, fect-, -fy = to do, to make

e.g. fact, infect & *-fect, stratify, terrific

facies, fici- = face, e.g. facia, facet, facial, superficial

faex/faecis = dregs

fascia = bundle

fatigare/fatigatum = grow weary, e.g. fatigue, indefatigable

Faunus = woodland god cf. Flora = flower goddess

febris = fever, e.g. febrile, febrifacient, February

femina = woman, e.g. feminine

fecunda/us/um = fertile, e.g. fecundity

fertilis = fertile, e.g. infertile, fetus = offspring

femur/femoris = thigh(bone)

fenestra = window, e.g. defenestration, *Fr* fenêtre

ferre/latum = carry, e.g. transfer, translation,

conifer, -ferous, suffer, relative, circumference

ferrum = iron, Fe, ferrous, ferriferous

fervere = boil (cf. bullire), e.g. fervent, effervescent

fibra = fiber, fibril, fibrillation

filum = thread, e.g. filament

figere/fixum = fasten, e.g. prefix, fixation

fibula = broach (safety-pin), outer leg bone <- *figibula

findere/fisum = split, e.g. fission, fissure, -fid, multifid
