= birth, race, kind, class e.g. genera (plural)

gignere/genitum = beget, e.g. genital, genitive, indigenous

gerere/gestum = to carry, bear (cf. ferre/latum)

germen/germinis = sprout, e.g. germinate, germicide

gingiva = gum (dentis), e.g. gingival

glans/glandis = acorn, e.g. gland
